Committee Meeting

A committee meeting was held on the 5th February. See the notice board for the minutes when they become available.

Of note were discussions around the small wheel runway (see below), the upcoming Kempton Festival, and repair of the fence where a vehicle had entered the field.

Small Wheel Runway Update

The Committee has agreed to extending the SWR by another 5-10m. It was also agreed that to do so would mean purchasing a new cylinder mower. Watch this space, hopefully sometime this year we will have a new mower (the Committee will be applying for TMAA funding) and begin extending the runway.

The committee are eager to progress the installation of a new parallel runway that is more suitable for small wheel models, this will be a long-term project.

Club Maintenance

After many years of service to the club, Barry Gerard has called time on his maintenance duties. He has worked tirelessly on the garden and general cleaning and maintenance of the grounds. On behalf of the club, we thank Barry for his work and hope he enjoys a well-earned rest.

We are needing more people to take on these roles as currently it is left to just a few members. New bin liners are available in the kitchen drawers in the club house. If you swap a gas bottle for a new one please notify a committee member so someone can replace it with a new one. Even better, take it to the garage and replace with a new one yourself. Write up any supplies needed on the white board in the club house.

Maintaining the club house, toilet block and grounds is not the responsibility of any one member. We all need to take some responsibility for ensuring the place is left neat and tidy so it can be enjoyed by all.



This month has seen some good flying weather being enjoyed by the Club stalwarts as well as other members of the Club. Kelly Fields also played host to the Australian Army testing Drone Controllers.
